C. 300.2.D. Northern Section CIF Classification

Student moving up and down between JV and Varsity must not exceed game limitations **m/s/c**
Take affect July 1

D. 301.3 Player and Coach Ejections

Change in interpretation. There are more cases where a JV and Varsity coach are working together.

If a coach is ejected from one level, they may not coach in the next level. Tournament directors may add to tourney rules for out of section schools. Referred back to conference/leagues.

V. QUALIFICATION AND SEEDING CRITERIA

Split teams for tournaments.

- a. A school may only split a Varsity team once during a season for competition to exceed Section contest limitations.
b. A split team may be utilized only when a scheduled team drops out of a school's tournament. Split teams may not be used in tournaments when the host school was not able to complete their tournament bracket.
c. One of the split teams must be designated as the school's team of record for that tournament. All contests with this team will be recorded as wins and/or losses and used to calculate Section Playoff points.
d. Teams playing non-designated teams (second teams) are considered No-Contest games and will not be recorded on their record and will not be used to calculate Section Playoff points.
e. Frosh and JV programs may split teams providing the team and/or individuals do not exceed the Section contest limitations.

205.5 NORTHERN SECTION ACADEMIC AWARDS / SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

Information and applications pertaining to participation in these scholarship and award programs will be listed on the Section website for each school Principal and/or Athletic Director.

A. Scholarships

1. Scholarships will be awarded to a male and female in each of the three conferences. The Ed Hendrix Scholarship to the National Conference, the Gregg LeMaster Scholarship to the American Conference, and the Darold Adamson Scholarship to the California Conference.
2. Each league may nominate a male and female to forward to Section office for consideration. **Nomination deadline is May 1st of each year.**
3. Recipients must be graduating Seniors at their respective member high schools.
4. The Section Scholarship Selection Committee, as appointed by the NSCIF President, will select recipients.
5. Recipients will receive the designated scholarship amount upon verification of enrollment to an accredited institution.
6. Amount of scholarship will be determined annually by Section Executive Committee.

B. Individual Scholastic Achievement

1. Awarded to any freshman, sophomore, junior or senior athlete competing at the Varsity level.
2. Athlete must achieve a 3.5 or better GPA (**unweighted**) during the grading period while that student is participating in a Varsity sport.
3. Applications must be submitted and verified by the Principal of each member high school by the 1st Wednesday in November for Fall sports, the 1st Wednesday in February for Winter sports, and the 2nd Wednesday in May for Spring sports.
4. Certificates will be issued from Section office upon receipt of applications.

C. All Scholastic Teams

1. Awarded to any Varsity team, having achieved a 3.0 or better composite GPA (**unweighted**) during the season of sport.
2. Applications must be submitted and verified by the Principal of each member high school by the 1st Wednesday in November for Fall sports, the 1st Wednesday in February for Winter sports, and the 2nd Wednesday in May for Spring sports.
3. When submitted by above deadline, the application will serve also as the application for Scholastic Championship Team consideration.
4. Membership to a team shall include all student-athletes participating during a given marking period. Students, who at the time of grades are issued, become academically ineligible, are included in the determination of the team GPA and **shall not be deleted** from the team roster.

5. Certificates will be issued to the school for each individual member of that team from the Section office upon receipt of applications.

D. Scholastic Championship Team

1. Awarded to the Varsity team in a given sport with the highest GPA submitted to the Section office by the designated deadlines.
2. Team will be awarded a Scholastic Championship Team Plaque for display.
3. Individual members of the Scholastic Championship Team shall receive a certificate recognizing their achievement.
4. The NSCIF Scholastic Championship Team will be forwarded to the State CIF for additional recognition.
