My name is Frank Koons. I am responding to the reply you sent to me via email to my question about the possibility of our school (C.O.R.E. Butte) becoming a part of the North Section of C.I.F. as an affiliate member.

CORE was established in 1998 as a California nonprofit benefit corporation to manage, operate, direct and promote a California public charter school. The 2005/6 school year represents our 8th year in operation. Originally, CORE provided instruction for grades K-8; grades 9-12 were added in 2000. CORE is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC.)

CORE's Paradise, Marysville Resource Centers opened in 1999, with a resource center in Chico, CA, not far behind. Acknowledging the growing community in Placer County, CORE opened an Auburn resource center, which has recently moved to Colfax, CA.

Having a school community that has unified once isolated pockets of homeschoolers, CORE is able to offer a dizzying array of opportunities. Resource center classes, field trips, community and college courses, field studies, leadership opportunities as well as the time-honored "kitchen table" learning are a taste of what goes on during a "typical day" for a CORE student.

Today, CORE's administrative office is located in Nevada City. We offer support for a Kindergarten through 12th grade education for appropriate families and students wanting an individualized, unique approach. We will always be committed to supporting a strong academic "trunk" with its roots in the family, with social development and college/vocational preparation as its natural outgrowth. As a personalized learning school, we expect to be at the forefront of education reform, offering a viable alternative to mainstream schools and acknowledging the unique gifts and learning styles of each individual. Students are accepted into the program just as they would in most public schools except in instances where it is deemed that the personalized learning approach would not be appropriate or profitable for the student. We offer a full array of college preparatory classes at C.O.R.E. Butte and our grading system for High School students is based on performance on regular testing, evaluations of projects/papers, and portfolio review.

We offer many core classes in our resource center in Chico and many of our students attend one or more classes at the center as part of their regular curriculum.

Our school, which is housed in Butte County and is called C.O.R.E. Butte has approximately 350 students k-12 and 125 912th grade students. What we are asking for is an opportunity for our high school students to participate in inter-scholastic sports. We recognize that we are yet ready to put together

and maintain teams to compete in most sports, but would like the opportunity for our students to participate in "individual" or small team sports.

We are hoping to gain participation in the following areas:

3. boys tennis (as individuals first)
4. boys golf (as individuals first)
5. wrestling (as individuals)
6. swimming (as individuals)
7. cross county (as individuals)
8. track and field (as individuals)
9. snow skiing/boarding (as individuals)

At some point we may be able to put together teams that could actually be included in the regular scheduling. For now, we are hoping to be able to give our kids the opportunity to prepare and participate by arrangement with other C.I.F. schools in scrimmages, tournaments, meets, etc.

Please advise us as to how we become members of your organization.

The Sacramento Valley league has agreed to have the Mid Valley League teams join them for the 2008-2010 realignment cycle.

Action Item D.

301.2 NORTHERN SECTION CIF CLASSIFICATION

D. A student may participate in a non-league interscholastic contest in an advanced class and may return to the lower class for League competition during that season of sport providing they do not violate any CIF or NSCIF Bylaws including, but not limited to: age limitations, maximum number of contests, and/or representing his/her school in but one classification per sport per day. A student, who participates on an advanced team in a League contest, may not return to a lower classification during that season of the sport. **Exceptions:** Skiing and Snowboarding, Track and Field (see note), and Wrestling.

Exception: J.V. football players may participate at the varsity level when an opposing school does not field a J.V. team. They may return the following week as an eligible player at the junior varsity level. All of Article 19 including 1900.1 Age Requirement must be complied with.

NOTE: In the sport of Track and Field, a boy or girl may change classification until the League final meet. The classifications in the League final meet for Track and Field determines the classification for all Section meets.

Request to add another exception –

In the California conference, JV players may participate at the varsity level when an opposing school does not field a JV team. They may return the following game as an eligible player at the JV level.

Action Item E.

302.3 PLAYER AND COACH EJECTIONS (Revised May 12, 2004)

- A. Any athlete or coach, as a participant or spectator of a contest, who is ejected for a flagrant foul, dangerous or unsportsmanlike conduct, or any athlete who leaves the confines of the bench or team area during a fight that may break out or has broken out, shall be disqualified from participating in the remainder of the contest and any subsequent JV and Varsity contests. The athlete or coach will also be suspended at all levels of competition for the team's next contest. The suspension of a coach shall include all levels of competition for that day and all levels of competition for the team's next contest. This Bylaw applies to a single season of sport and includes NSCIF Playoffs, NorCal Regional play, and CIF State Playoffs.

1. In tournament play, when multiple contests occur on one day, the athlete and/or coach ejected for any of the above incidents are suspended for the remainder of that contest and the next contest.
2. Officials are to report any and all ejections to the Northern Section as soon as possible.
3. Appeals are not granted because an ejection was not reported to the Section office.

NOTE: Coaches are not allowed in or around the facility before or during the contest for which he/she is suspended. See NSCIF Bylaw 302.6.

Note: A player, who is suspended from a game, due to an ejection in the previous game, may not dress down nor participate in warm ups nor introductions.

Action Item G.

SECTION DETERMINATION OF PLACEMENT OF SCHOOLS

Each section will determine their divisional placement in the sports of volleyball, cross country, and boys and girls basketball. Each section may use their own established criteria to determine the placement of their schools in the five divisions based on the following guidelines:

- Division I – No restrictions
- Division II – No restrictions
- Division III – No restrictions
- Division IV – Enrollment may not exceed 1250
- Division V – Enrollment may not exceed 500

Each section is required to submit the placement of their schools into the five divisions to the CIF State Office for all above names sports at a date to be determined.

Notes

- The CBEDS enrollment figures to be used for schools are those figures certified by the school principal in October of the previous year.
- The enrollment for the 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades shall be used to gain total enrollment figure for the school.
- The enrollment for single gender schools shall be doubled using the 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades to gain a total figure for the single gender school.

This passed at the May 2, 2008 Federated Council meeting for implementation in the 2008-09 school year.

Recommendation

The Northern Section stay with the current divisional guidelines for the 2008-09 school year and use that time to develop a criteria for placing schools within divisions.

- Division I – 2800+
- Division II – 1600-2799
- Division III – 1000- 1599
- Division IV – 400-999
- Division V – 399 and below
