59. NORTHERN SECTION ACADEMIC AWARDS / SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

Information and applications pertaining to participation in these scholarship and award programs will be listed on the Section website for each school Principal and/or Athletic Director.

A. Scholarships

1. Scholarships will be awarded to a male and female in each of the three conferences. The Ed Hendrix Scholarship to the National Conference, the Gregg LeMaster Scholarship to the American Conference, and the Darold Adamson Scholarship to the California Conference.
2. Each league may nominate a male and female to forward to Section office for consideration. **Nomination deadline is May 1st of each year.**
3. Recipients must be graduating Seniors at their respective member high schools.
4. The Section Scholarship Selection Committee, as appointed by the NSCIF President, will select recipients.
5. Recipients will receive the designated scholarship amount upon verification of enrollment to an accredited institution.
6. Amount of scholarship will be determined annually by Section Executive Committee.

B. Individual Scholastic Achievement

1. Awarded to any freshman, sophomore, junior or senior athlete competing at the Varsity level.
2. Athlete must achieve a 3.5 or better GPA (**unweighted**) during the grading period while that student is participating in a Varsity sport.
3. Applications must be submitted and verified by the Principal of each member high school by the 1st Wednesday in November for Fall sports, the 1st Wednesday in February for Winter sports, and the 2nd Wednesday in May for Spring sports.
4. Certificates will be issued from Section office upon receipt of applications.

C. All Scholastic Teams

1. Awarded to any Varsity team, having achieved a 3.0 or better composite GPA (**unweighted**) during the season of sport.
2. Applications must be submitted and verified by the Principal of each member high school by the 1st Wednesday in November for Fall sports, the 1st Wednesday in February for Winter sports, and the 2nd Wednesday in May for Spring sports.
3. When submitted by above deadline, the application will serve also as the application for **CIF** Scholastic Championship Team consideration.
4. Membership to a team shall include all student-athletes participating during a given marking period. Students, who at the time of grades are issued, become

301.3 PLAYER AND COACH EJECTIONS

- A. Any athlete or coach, *as a participant or spectator of a contest*, ejected . . . shall be disqualified from participating in the remainder of the ~~game~~ *contest and any subsequent JV and Varsity contests. The athlete or coach and* will also be suspended *at all levels of competition* for the team's next contest. This Bylaw applies to . . .
1. *In tournament play when multiple contests occur on one day, the athlete and/or coach ejected for any of the above incidents are suspended for the remainder of that contest and the next contest.*
 2. *Officials are to report any and all ejections to the Northern Section as soon as possible.*
 3. *Appeals are not granted because an ejection was not reported to the Section office.*
- Note: Coaches are not allowed in or around the facility during the contest for which he/she is suspended. See NSCIF Bylaw 301.6.*
- B. Second Offense: Same language with two game suspension.
- C. Third Offense: Same language with season suspension. **Note: If this ever happens to a coach, and a school does not suspend the coach, we will probably have to defend it in court.**

301.6 COACH PENALTIES

A coach who was ejected from his/her team's previous contest for any unsportsmanlike conduct shall not be allowed in or around the locker room one (1) hour prior to the start of his/her suspended contest or at halftime (if applicable). The suspended coach may not be allowed on or around the team bench, playing field, or court *in or around the facility* during the contest for which he/she was suspended.

NSCIF Sportsmanship Guidelines

The Northern Section CIF Sportsmanship Guidelines have been developed to maintain the highest possible standards in our athletic programs and to promote a positive attitude toward high school athletics by all involved.

Note: Schools are expected to adhere to the Northern Section Sportsmanship Guidelines.

Conferences, Leagues, and/or individual schools may enact guidelines that are more stringent than those adopted by the Section

A. Signs, banners, and/or school flags.

1. Signs with positive and supportive messages are allowed.
2. Derogatory signs are prohibited and will not be allowed and will be removed by school/game officials. Derogatory signs include, but are not limited to, any sign making reference to an opponent, the players, coaches, any participants, the school, and/or the school mascot.
3. Signs are to remain in the schools' designated area.
4. School flags/banners or ceremonial objects may only be displayed on the respective school's side of the field or court.
5. Individuals or groups carrying signs, school banners, and/or school ceremonial objects are not to run in front of or near an opponents "rooting section" as it often incites and offends that section of fans.

B. Seating Policy

1. In order that all spectators may experience maximum enjoyment at NSCIF athletic events, spectators (particularly students) wishing to audibly cheer or support a particular team as a group, be ~~seated in~~ **assigned to** an area designated as their "rooting section" and remain there for the duration of the contest.
2. ~~Seating~~ **Assigning an area** of an opposing "rooting section" with or near an opponent's "rooting section" is to be avoided wherever possible and such persons shall be directed by staff and/or game management to the appropriate ~~seating~~ location provided for them.

3. Designated "rooting sections" should be communicated to schools involved so as to avoid moving groups of people from one location to another.

C. Warm-up Procedures

1. Protocol will allow visiting teams to take the court/field followed by the home team. Other arrangements may be made by Game Administration.
2. Teams are not to run through or disrupt an opponent's pre-game warm-up procedure.
3. Where applicable (football, basketball, soccer, field hockey) mid-field/mid-court should be kept as clear as possible. The court/field should be visually divided into thirds. The middle third should be void of any warm-up activity or team ritual. Any team huddles or rituals should occur in the team's third of the field/court.
4. Volleyball warm up procedure is to follow the NFHS rulebook.
5. For baseball/softball the (home) team will take infield first. The opponent shall remain in the dugout or bench area while infield is being conducted. Exception: Bull pen personnel.

D. Announcers

1. The announcer is an important component of any athletic contest. He/she must remain neutral and considered an official of the contest. Public address announcers **are not radio commentators.**
2. The announcer should welcome opponents and notify participants of emergency exits, restrooms, concessions, sportsmanship expectations, and other pertinent information.
3. The announcer acknowledges and introduces the game officials.
4. The announcer makes every effort to pronounce the names of the participants correctly in their introductions remembering that this contest is not a professional arena or venue.
5. The announcer may recognize sponsorship information as appropriate.

E. Spectator Expectations

1. No artificial noisemakers are allowed for basketball or volleyball. These include, but are not limited to, megaphones (manufactured or created from other material), cowbells, sirens, 'clackers,' cans with marbles or rocks inside, or other creative noisemakers.
2. Any form of taunting which is intended or designed to embarrass, ridicule, or demean others will not be tolerated under any circumstances. ~~Examples would include, but not limited to, chants such as "air ball," "bounce, bounce, bounce" at a free throw line in basketball. Cheering to disrupt a serve or an opponents play on the ball in volleyball.~~
3. Spectators may never refer to any participants/competitors by name. Chanting a competitors' name is considered taunting.
4. Shirts must be worn at all times. **Body painting is not acceptable.** Face painting is allowed providing it does not make reference to an opponent.

F. Bands

1. Bands may only play during dead ball situations in volleyball and basketball (between games, between quarters, and/or time-outs).
2. Bands may play at any time during a football game providing they do not hinder the play of the opponent as determined by the official.

I. DIVISIONS

according to their previous year 9-12 CBEDS enrollment. Schools will be placed in their proper enrollment division for NSCIF Playoffs as follows:

Change in numbers would mean the following for the Boys:

1. Division I would consist of 13 schools. Basically, current Division I and II combined as Div. I, except Live Oak and Willows.
2. Live Oak and Willows combined with current boys Division III for Div. II. Would consist of 14 schools.

Change in numbers would mean the following for the Girls:

1. Anderson, Corning, Sutter, and Yreka would move to Division I, which would have 9 schools.
2. The remainder would be Division II schools, which would have 12 schools.

II. **ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

One representative from each of the following leagues: Butte View, Greater Mountain Valley, Mid Valley, Sacramento Valley, and Shasta Cascade Leagues.~~

VI. ENTRY FEES

- A. There is a one-time entry fee of \$60 per team (including the host team).
- ~~B. The entry fee is to be paid to the host school prior to the first game of the Tournament. Schools failing to pay entry fees on time will be charged an additional \$5.00 by the NSCIF. The entry fee check is to be made payable to the host school and used to pay officials and other expenses. Excess entry fees will be sent to the NSCIF office. The host school is responsible for collecting entry fees.~~
- ~~C. No additional entry fee will be charged for successive games, however, the home team is responsible for the cost of the officials in the second round of the play offs.
 - 1. Admission fees may be charged to offset the cost of officials for the second round.
 - 2. Host schools should notify their opponent of admission fees in advance of the contest.
 - 3. If admission is charged, the net profit resulting from the contest will be sent to the NSCIF office. Losses will not be reimbursed.~~

The coach will choose which four swimmers will represent the team and may substitute the fifth swimmer in place of another swimmer. If necessary the event will be re-seeded.~~
