Recommend as a basic policy that deliberations are done behind closed doors
    - Volleyball Officials Contracts decrease \$73 to \$63. Compromise \$68 for Varsity/JV Fee (with rally scoring they work less hours)
    - Baseball/Softball – end of season
    - Bball – asking for \$15 year per school increase assignor and service fee.  
Scratch policy is difficult because they do not have enough officials. Recommend that they will honor the scratch policy as best they can.
