I. TRAVEL ALLOWANCE

Travel allowance will be adjusted annually to the IRS allowable (\$.375 for 2004-05). Mileage is per mile round trip for driver only. Refer to each specific sport for rider mileage. Travel allowance will be paid to officials for Volleyball, Basketball, and Football at the close of each sport season. For all other sports and tournaments, the host school will pay the mileage. Fees and mileage for playoff games shall be billed directly to and paid by the Northern Section.

II. ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR LONG-DISTANCE TRAVEL

Additional compensation of \$12 will be paid to each official, excluding the driver, that is required to travel at least 90 miles one way to the host school.

III. EVALUATION OF OFFICIALS

At the end of the season, each Association will send out a list of their membership to schools so that coaches may offer input to officials' evaluations. Areas to be evaluated may include, but are not limited to, knowledge of rules, judgement, punctuality, professionalism, interaction with coaches and players, comments, and an overall rating.

IV. NOTES

- A. Schools may not pay more nor less than the designated amount.
- B. If assigned officials report to the site of a canceled or postponed game because they were not notified three (3) hours prior to the game they will be paid one-half (1/2) of the single game fee plus mileage.
NOTE: If officials are traveling 1 ½ hours or more, a 4 hour cancellation notice is preferred.
- C. In the event of the non-arrival of official(s), the contest may proceed by mutual consent of the competing schools.
- D. The usual number of officials (if available) will be assigned unless otherwise requested by home school and if not in violation of the rules of the sport concerned.
- E. Officials are considered to be independent contractors and are not covered by Workers' Compensation programs of the school districts of the Northern Section CIF or the State CIF.
