

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## Constitutional Editorial Changes

First Issue – The Northern Section had a player participate in outside competition, and it was not discovered until the conclusion of the season. After conferring with other commissioners, the application of the penalty is, if the student/athlete is not a senior, the penalty of participating in 1 game warrants the player being ineligible for 2 games waits until the next season. For example, if the 10<sup>th</sup> grade athlete is a basketball player they would be ineligible for the number of games during their 11<sup>th</sup> grade basketball season. If the athlete is a senior, they would be ineligible for the next season of sport during their senior year. For example, if the athlete was a 12<sup>th</sup> grade basketball player they would be ineligible for the number of games in baseball, or whatever spring sport they play during their 12<sup>th</sup> grade year.

It was recommended by Principal George Griffin, that this be included in the Constitution.

Background information –

605. **BYLAW 600 PENALTY**

A. **Individual**

(1) **First Offense in High School Career in Any Sport**

The student becomes immediately ineligible for participation with his/her high school team for a number of contests equal to twice the number of contests of outside competition in which the student participated.

(2) **Any Subsequent Offense in High School Career in Any Sport**

The student becomes immediately ineligible for one year (365 days) from the second infraction in all sports.

(3) **Appeals**

Upon written appeal to the Section commissioner, the student may petition his/her Section for reinstatement of his/her eligibility status.

B. **Team**

(1) **Games Forfeited**

Games in which a student participated on his/her high school team after violation of CIF Bylaw 600 shall be forfeited.

(2) **Appeals**

Sections may establish rules and procedures to consider requests for waivers of game forfeitures.

(Revised May 2004 Federated Council)

Recommendation-

This is an editorial change and not a change to the Constitution, so it can be added without two readings.

Second Issue – For several years, an exception has been made for Bylaw 301.2 D, for baseball tournaments during spring break after the league season has begun. The rationale for this is that some pitcher may not be available because their families are out of town and the team needs to bring up JV pitchers for this tournament only. It has been recommended that this is added to the Constitution. The next question -does this apply to softball pitchers? Does this apply to basketball tournaments during winter break?

#### Background Information –

#### Bylaw 301.2 D-

A student may participate in a non-league interscholastic contest in an advanced class and may return to the lower class for League competition during that season of sport providing they do not violate any CIF or NSCIF Bylaws including, but not limited to: age limitations, maximum number of contests, and/or representing his/her school in but one classification per sport per day. A student, who participates on an advanced team in a League contest, may not return to a lower classification during that season of the sport. **Exceptions:** Skiing and Snowboarding, Track and Field (see note), and Wrestling. In the California Conference, JV players may participate at the varsity level when an opposing school does not field a JV team. They may return the following game as an eligible player at the JV level.

*Exception: J.V. football players may participate at the varsity level when an opposing school does not field a J.V. team. They may return the following week as an eligible player at the junior varsity level. All of Article 19 including 1900.1 Age Requirement must be complied with.*

NOTE: In the sport of Track and Field, a boy or girl may change classification until the League final meet. The classifications in the League final meet for Track and Field determines the classification for all Section meets.

#### Recommendation –

This should not apply to softball because softball does not have the same pitching limitations as baseball does. This does not apply to basketball because there are no limitations on the number of minutes an individual can play.

## Hot Topics in the CIF

I have received a recommendation that the Section puts together a “hot topics” correspondence to keep the school administration and leagues up to date on issues in the State as well as the Northern Section. Since I believe communication is essential, *here goes...*

Bylaw 600 – a first reading in May at the State Federated Council– “A student on a high school team becomes ineligible if the student ***tries out, practices or*** competes in a contest on an 'outside' team, in the same sport, during the student’s high school season of sport.” Currently trying out and practicing are not included in this bylaw.

This will go hand in hand with the State goal of instituting a maximum hour limit for coach’s contact with student athletes. Bylaw 310- “a student-athletes participation in countable athletically related activities shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) hours per day and eighteen (18) hours per week, including practice and contests.” This is to prevent overuse injuries and minimize interference with the athletes’ academic program.

Wrestling – First reading in May State Federated Council, second reading in Oct. for immediate implementation.

### **PENALTIES FOR MAXIMUM # CONTEST VIOLATION**

Violation of Article 3101 will result in the following sanctions:

- a. **Matches; if an athlete goes over the prescribed 40 match limit the athlete shall be ineligible for any further competition for the season.**

**In addition to the above sanctions, the Section, depending on the violation, may impose the following additional sanctions:**

- (1) The final season record will be reduced by at least one win at the conclusion of the season;
- (2) The school will be placed on probation;
- (3) The team/individual will be ineligible to advance to or in Section, Regional or State Championships;
- (4) Reduction of maximum number of matches allowed for the following year in that sport;
- (5) Repeated violation may result in suspension of membership in the CIF.

As leagues you need to be aware of the proposals that the football committee is seeking each leagues input of.

## Prior Contact Policy for the Northern Section

Issue- When must a coach or schools disclose prior contact for incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders?

Background Information –  
State Constitution 510 A -

### Pre-Enrollment Contact

Any and all pre-enrollment contact of any kind whatsoever with a student must be disclosed by the student, parent(s)/guardian(s)/caregiver and the schools to the Section office on a completed CIF Pre-Enrollment Contact Affidavit (CIF Form 510). Pre-enrollment contact may include, but is not limited to: any communication of any kind, directly or indirectly, with the student, parent(s)/guardian(s)/caregiver, relatives, or friends of the student about the athletic programs at a school; orientation/information programs, shadowing programs; attendance at outside athletic events or the like by anyone associated\* with the school to observe the student; participation by the student in programs supervised by the school or its associates before enrollment in the school.

Most Sections only require a 510 form if there is an allegation and use the form as part of the investigation.

Discussion -If a coach has prior contact with an athlete outside their attendance zone and the athlete enrolls in their school, should they disclose the prior contact prior to an accusation? What about club coaches? How would this impact a private school? If you put on a camp for junior high students, should/could you just submit a list of attendees to your AD?

Recommendation – Waiting for an allegation to materialize, seems to be too late. Will coaches/schools wait until contests have been played? I'm not sure what is doable and not cumbersome. Possibly coaches submitting a list of incoming freshmen that they have had prior contact with to the AD and then the AD forwards the list to the Section Office and it is held until there is an allegation/investigation. Or should the Northern Section wait until there is an allegation, and then require the 510 form?

This revision would require fees to be paid at the time of application and sets deadline dates for new and renewed applications.

The majority of multi school requests, whether new or renewals, are late. It takes an inordinate amount of staff time to process paperwork, invoice and then follow up when fees are not paid in a timely manner. It is rare when a school pays on the first notice.

This revision also reinforces the deadline date for new applications. If the application is late the application will be rejected. For renewals if the application is late, a late fee of \$200 will be assessed before approving the application. In both cases the fees must accompany the application or the application will not be approved.

303. **MULTI-SCHOOL TEAM**

- A. CIF-member schools may allow only students currently enrolled, in grades 9-12, in their school, to participate in any CIF competition (See Bylaw 201).
- B. Any non-CIF-member school that wishes to have its students participate in CIF competition must apply for multi-school status through a CIF-member school prior to October 1 of the current school year. A non-CIF-member school must have a California County-District-School Code (CDS Code) as a prerequisite to applying for multi-school status.
- (1) All new applications must be received in the State Office prior to May 31 of the current school year for approval for the following school year.**
- (2) All fees must accompany the application or the request will not be approved until such time the fees are submitted as long as the fees submitted are prior to the deadline of May 31.**
- (3) Students are not eligible to participate or compete with the CIF member school until confirmation from the CIF State Office has been received that the application has been approved.**
- C. Any CIF-member school that wishes to allow participation on its team(s) by students, who are currently enrolled in non-CIF-member schools or programs which do not offer any interscholastic athletic programs [such programs or schools would include, but not be limited to, alternative schools (as defined in Education Code Section 58500 et seq.), junior high schools, necessary small schools and charter schools], may request approval to do so under the following conditions:
- (1) The administrative responsibility for all students involved in athletics shall rest with the principal of the CIF-member school for which the student(s) is competing. Such responsibility shall include:
- Verification that residential eligibility of the student(s) is limited to the public school in whose attendance area his/her parent(s)/guardian(s)/caregiver reside; or where the student most recently established his/her residential eligibility or a private school; AND
  - Verification that students participating in the athletic program meet all the CIF-member school scholastic eligibility requirements; AND
  - The regular grading period of the CIF-member school shall be used to determine the scholastic eligibility of all students; AND
  - Determination that students participating in the athletic program meet all other eligibility requirements of the CIF, its Section, its league and the CIF-member school; AND
  - Determination that private schools and charter schools entering a multi-school agreement with a public school or public school district meet the additional requirements set forth in E.-F. below.
- (2) For the purposes of determining dues, legal and liability assessments, realignment issues and State CIF and Section divisional placement, the enrollment figures for non-CIF-member school/program students residing in the CIF-member school's attendance area must be included in the CIF-member school's enrollment using the CBEDS enrollment figures.
- (3) The application process must start with the principal of the CIF-member school. Written certification that all the conditions listed above will be met, as well as approval, must be obtained from the following:
- CIF-member school principal; AND

- b. CIF-member school governing board(s); AND
  - c. Non-CIF-member school or program administrator in charge; AND
  - d. Non-CIF-member school governing board (if applicable)
- (4) Additional approvals must be obtained, in the following order, from:
- a. The CIF-member school's League; AND
  - b. The CIF-member school's Section; AND
  - c. The State CIF Executive Committee
- (5) Appeals Procedure (Applies only to (4) above)
- a. If the CIF-member school is unable to obtain written approval from the appropriate league, then it may appeal for approval, in writing, to its Section, but only after exhausting any and all appeals procedures established by the respective league.
  - b. If the CIF-member school and its league are unable to obtain written approval from the appropriate Section, they may appeal for approval, in writing, to the Executive Committee, but only after exhausting any and all appeals procedures established by the respective Section.
- (6) Renewal applications, including all signatures in (3) and (4) above, for multi-school teams under this bylaw must be filed annually prior to the ensuing school year.
- a. All renewal applications must be submitted to the State Office by May 31 of the current school year to continue multi school status.**
  - b. All fees must be enclosed with the application or the application will not be approved. Any late applications will be assessed a late fee of \$200. If an application for renewal is not received by September 1 of the current school year, it will not be approved.**
  - c. Students are not eligible to participate or compete with the CIF member school until confirmation has been received from the CIF State Office that the application has been approved.**

**D. Small Learning Communities, Small Schools, Alternative Schools, and Charter Schools Housed On A Member School's Campus**

- (1) Students in small learning communities, small schools, alternative schools or charter schools housed on an existing member school's campus are eligible at the member school upon their initial enrollment in the 9th grade. Small learning communities, small schools, alternative schools and charter schools housed on an existing member school's campus are not required to apply for multi-school status through the member school.
- (2) Students transferring into small learning communities, small schools, alternative schools or charter schools housed on an existing member school's campus after their initial enrollment in the 9th grade are subject to Bylaw 207.
- (3) Sections are empowered to waive the transfer rule upon request by a school district establishing a new magnet program, small learning community, small school, alternative school or charter school housed on a member school's campus for the first year only; thereafter, all transfer rules apply.
- (4) If a small learning community, small school, alternative school or charter school is housed on an existing member school's campus, its students are not eligible to participate for any CIF-member

school other than the member school on whose campus the small learning community, small school, alternative school or charter school is housed.

**E. Private and Charter Schools Partnering With CIF-Member Public Schools Housed On a Separate Campus**

Where a private school or a charter school enters into a multi-school agreement with a public school that is housed on a separate campus or with a public school district, only those students who live within the boundaries of the public school district may participate in athletics at the member school or at a member school within the district. A student attending such a private school or charter school must participate for the member school in whose attendance area his/her parent(s)/guardian(s)/caregiver reside or the school in the district where the student most recently established residential eligibility prior to attending the private or charter school entering the multi-school agreement.

**F. CIF-Member School with Multiple Campuses**

Teams representing a high school must be composed of students under the direct supervision of one principal and attending class on one campus. Where one school has multiple campuses, a student must participate for the team on whose campus he/she is housed unless the school petitions to be allowed to participate as a single school with multiple campuses under the supervision of one principal. These petitions must be filed prior to October 1 of the current school year.

**DEFINITIONS**

**School Within a School**

*This type of school (often times referred to as Academies with a particular academic focus) operating under the umbrella of a comprehensive high school, but has no autonomy in terms of academic accountability.*

**Small Learning Communities**

*These schools have their own complete accountability in terms of having their own CDS code, API scores and their own CAHSEE pass rate.*

**G. Continuation Schools**

Continuation schools may not apply for multi-school team status as provided for under this provision. For continuation school eligibility, refer to Bylaw 212.

### Issue #2 – Increasing the number of teams in each division

In order to eliminate a bye week for the number 1 and 2 seeded teams and help with the shrinking number of teams in Division V, the thought was to have 12 teams in each division, with 8 teams moving on to the playoffs. Either the top division or the bottom division would have 10 teams.

### Issue #3 – Central Location for Championship games-

All championship games would be played at one site, possibly Oroville's new facility. The committee would help run the game, but the highest seeded team would also have a large responsibility in hosting and running their game. The concession stand would possibly be a joint effort between the two schools playing. There would be two games on Friday night with three on Saturday.
