FROM: CHESTER HIGH SCHOOL VOLLEYBALL
RE: OFFICIALS

Chester High School would like to begin using officials from the Chico Volleyball Association beginning with the 2012 season for the following reasons:

1. Inconsistent interpretation of the rules. For example:
 - a. Telling tall players in front row they have to take a knee so the other team can see the serve.
 - b. Telling players they will receive a yellow card if they do not go get the ball.
2. Unable to cover all games forcing either rescheduling or cancellation. This year we had to forfeit a game after being informed the morning of the contest that there were no officials for the game. This has also happened in the past and is always a concern. When this does happen we are responsible for securing officials at the last minute instead of our assignor.
3. Association was not certified to cover playoff contests this season. Feather River Association schools were informed via email about a week prior to playoffs that we were to contact the Chico Association if we needed officials for a home game. This is at least the second time this has happened in the last 5-6 years.
4. Travel costs will not be dramatically affected, if at all. All of the volleyball officials currently come out of the Quincy or Portola areas and travel 100 to 175 miles round trip. Round trip from Chico to Chester is approximately 175 miles.
5. Consistency. The other teams in our league either use Chico or Redding officials.
6. Lassen High School uses the Chico Association for all sports which is approximately 75 miles further round trip.

Attached you will find three proposals for CIF rule changes on which we need to take action.

1. **CIF, Article 20, Bylaws 200-210**—No substantive changes are contained in this proposal. It includes some new language that is reflective of current practices and interpretations, and some movement of items to new bylaw locations, but no substantive changes. See Attached
2. **CIF 206**—Choice of Schools Following Valid Change of Residence: There are three competing proposals on this issue. See Attached
206-1 Makes the choice of schools the same for public and private schools by making less restrictions on choice than the current bylaw has.
206-2 Makes the choice of schools the same for public and private schools by placing more restrictions on choice than the current bylaw has.
206-3 Status quo—leave the current rule as it is.
3. **CIF 207/208/209/510**—Substantive changes in the way that transfer students become eligible. This moves all of 209.B (foreign transfers not in a program) into 207 so they are treated just like domestic transfers.
Keeps Limited and Unlimited eligibility as currently written and defined in the rule.
Changes exceptions to the Limited Eligibility transfers--
 - A. Hardships are more narrowly defined and limited to documentable hardship exceptions
 - B. Remove 1 easy move for sophomores
 - C. Allow students who do not meet the more narrow hardship definition to play at the varsity level after a pre-prescribed date establishing a consistent Sit Out Period. Such students would be allowed to play approximately the last 6 weeks of each season.

200—Philosophy and Rules References--no substantive changes

201—Standards of Enrollment-new language reflecting current practice and interpretation of standards of enrollment

202—Accurate Information-no changes

203—Age Requirement-no changes

204—8 Semester—no substantive changes

205—Scholastic Eligibility-no substantive changes

206-Valid Change of Residence—Substantive Changes in Choice of Schools following a valid change of residence:

206-1 PROPOSAL

This proposed language change gives the student more options of school choice after a valid change of residence. This language attempts to treat all schools the same and is less restrictive than the current language.

RATIONALE: If a student can choose to go to any private school after a valid change of residence, why do we limit which public schools they can attend? If a public school district allows a student to enroll in a school other than the school into whose attendance area the family moved, why does the CIF try to restrict this?

206-2 PROPOSAL

This proposed language change is more restrictive and 206-1 AND more restrictive than the current language. This language attempts to treat all school the same, but is more restrictive in limiting the choice of private schools as it does for public and charter schools.

RATIONALE: Student should only be eligible in the public school into whose attendance area they move. This restricts which private school(s) in which they can enroll; also restricts which charter schools in which they can enroll and gain athletic eligibility after a valid change of residence.

- (i) **student enrolls, attends, and/or is carried on the attendance roll at the new public school (School B) into whose attendance area the family moved or a private school closer geographically to the new family residence than any other private school or a charter school within the boundaries of School B's attendance area; AND**

206-3 PROPOSAL

OVERVIEW OF PROPOSAL FOR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGE TO TRANSFER STUDENT ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATIONS

Overview of Sit Out Period (SOP) for Transfer Students

- A transfer student is one who changes schools, but the family does not make a valid change of address (no change)
- All transfer students must complete CIF Forms 207/510 (no change).
- Student must be academically eligible at the time of transfer. If not, student cannot be deemed eligible until the first full grading period at the new school. (no change)
- Transfer students will be deemed ineligible if they are transferring due to a discipline issue at their prior school (Bylaw 210). (No change)
- The principal and athletic director of both schools must attest in writing that the move was not in violation of Undue Influence (CIF Bylaw 510). This will be as it is now done on Form 510. (no change)
- Student cannot transfer to a school where their former coach has relocated or where a club coach with whom they have been associated, is coaching. This is Bylaw 207. C (3) and (4). (no change)
- A student could be made eligible by a section commissioner quickly and easily in any sport that they did not compete in the prior 12 months.
- Upon transfer to new school and written approval, a student may be determined to be eligible by a section commissioner quickly and easily at the sub-varsity level, in a sport that they have played in the previous 12 months. A student who is granted eligibility under this provision at the lower level in such a sport cannot compete at the varsity level in that sport for the duration of that sport season, including section and state playoffs.
- Student may be deemed eligible for unlimited varsity eligibility in all sports by a section commissioner ONLY if the student meets one of the following hardship criteria:
 1. Court Ordered Transfers
 2. Children of Divorced Parents (eligible in the attendance area of the parent's domicile where they are residing).
 3. Individual Student Safety Incidents (must be documented with the school and/or police).
 4. Return to Previous School (no change).
 5. Foster Children (no change).
 6. Military Service (no change).
 7. Married Status (no change).
 8. Board of Education Ruling (no change)

- All other transfer students who don't qualify for an exception under the hardship criteria above, but want to play varsity) will have a Sit Out Period (SOP) for any sport that they have played in the previous 12 months. They will become eligible for competition on the following days for the next two years:

Fall: Monday of NFHS Week 14
2012-October 1, 2012
2013-October 6, 2013

Winter: Monday of NFJS Week 27
2012-December 31, 2013
2013-January 6, 2014

Spring: Monday of NFHS Week 40
2012-April 1, 2013
2013-April 7, 2014

- Students who transfer into a school after the first game will have their SOP period determined by the Section Commissioner so that it is equivalent to the SOP of other students who transferred before the first game.
- The Section Commissioner/staff will meet with school officials if their school has three or more transfers for a given sport in the same school year to discuss and review their transfer guidelines.
- Appeals: The only appeal will be in regard to a finding by the Section Commissioner that the student was in violation of CIF Bylaw 207 C (following a coach) or 510 (undue influence). There are no appeals in regard to the Sit Out Period (SOP)
- Hardships are not appealable other than in these two categories because all the hardship conditions are factual documentable circumstances. Either the student and their family are able to document the hardship to meet one of these three criteria or they do not.

Students who are academically ineligible at their previous school will not be eligible to compete at their new school until the requirements in Bylaw 205 are met and the new school has completed a grading period to verify that the student has met the CIF and school district academic eligibility requirements. A student cannot be placed on probation at the new school to fulfill this requirement; AND
- (2) The principal of the former school attests in writing that the move was not made in violation of CIF Bylaw 510 (b); AND

- v. The student is fully eligible under all other rules of the CIF.

(g) **Married Status**

A student who marries and lives with the student's spouse **shall be determined to be immediately residentially eligible for unlimited participation** in interscholastic athletics in the school in the attendance area in which the student **and their spouse** resides.

(h) **Board of Education Ruling:**

A student, or group of students, who transfer as a direct result of a ruling by the Board of Education of a school district that has two or more high schools and which mandates a change of school attendance boundaries shall be determined to be immediately residentially eligible for unlimited participation in interscholastic athletics in the school in the attendance area in which the student(s) are required to attend, provided the Board of Education Ruling is not a result of a disciplinary situation.

d. **APPEALS.**

All eligibility determinations made by the respective CIF/Section office under the provisions of 207.5.c are final as all three of these hardship circumstances are factual in nature and can be documented. B. Eight Consecutive Semester Rule

NEW EXPANDED, CLARIFYING LANGUAGE

A student who first enters the 9th grade of any school following the student's completion of the 8th grade in any school may be eligible for athletic competition during a maximum period of time that is not to exceed eight consecutive semesters following the initial enrollment in the 9th grade of any school and/or in any classes taken subsequent to the completion of the 8th grade, whether or not the student is enrolled in school, whether or not the student is academically or otherwise eligible and whether or not the student avails themselves of the opportunity to participate in Interscholastic sports during this time. The CIF allows only 8 consecutive semesters of eligibility available to the student, and Eligibility is only available must be used during the student's first eight consecutive semesters of enrollment in high school (grades 9-12) at that school or any other school.

C. Section Waivers:

- (1) **Waiving Semester Limitation:** Each Section may, at its discretion, establish rules and procedures for waiving the limitation on 8 semesters of eligibility, providing:
 - a. The student is required by the student's school principal to return to grade eight from grade nine and the student did not take part in an interscholastic contest while in the 9th grade, for the first time; OR
 - b. The student, because of mid-year completion of an 8th grade or a mid-year completion of the 9th grade in a Junior high school, is required by the student's school principal to repeat a semester of work in order to conform to a school program having annual terms, AND
 - c. The student has not taken part in an interscholastic athletic contest while enrolled for the first time in the semester which the student's school principal required the student to repeat.

206-1 PROPOSAL

This proposed language change gives the student more options of school choice after a valid change of residence. This language attempts to treat all schools the same and is less restrictive than the current language.

RATIONALE: If a student can choose to go to any private school after a valid change of residence, why do we limit which public schools they can attend? If a public school district allows a student to enroll in a school other than the school into whose attendance area the family moved, why does the CIF try to restrict this?

- (i) **student enrolls, attends, and/or is carried on the attendance roll at the new public school (School B) into whose attendance area the family moved, or another public school in accordance with the district(s) policies or a private school or a charter school; AND**

206-2 PROPOSAL

This proposed language change is more restrictive and 206-1 AND more restrictive than the current language. This language attempts to treat all schools the same, but is more restrictive in limiting the choice of private schools as it does for public and charter schools.

RATIONALE: Student should only be eligible in the public school into whose attendance area they move. This restricts which private school(s) in which they can enroll; also restricts which charter schools in which they can enroll and gain athletic eligibility after a valid change of residence.

II. ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Advisory Committee consists of one Division Coordinator ~~who~~ from each of the ~~each of the~~ above Divisions; meetings are in the fall and spring of each year. Nordic and Alpine disciplines meet separately on the same day.

1. The Alpine Championships will be invitational based on:

A. Each full team will bring a minimum of three racers per event. An event is either Slalom or Giant Slalom.

NSCIF SOCCER PLAYOFF QUALIFYING GUIDELINES

I. DIVISIONS

The Northern Section has two seasons of sport for soccer. The two seasons of sport for soccer are the Fall and the winter. The soccer guidelines will be applied to schools participating in each season of sport in exactly the same manner. Due to the disparity in school sizes and number of schools participating during each season of sport (Fall and Winter), the guidelines for assigning teams to a division, for play-off purposes, will vary slightly for each season of the sport. The goal in each case is to take into account the unique mixture of schools participating in each season of sport and utilize a system that will be objective and fair when placing schools into a division for the play-offs.

- A. **FALL SEASON: All schools will be ranked from largest to smallest and divided by two in order to form two equal divisions (Division II and Division III). If the number of schools is not equally divisible by two, thus creating a situation where there are two equal divisions plus one school, then Division III will have one extra school relative to Division II.**
- B. **WINTER SEASON:** The number of schools that play varsity soccer in the northern section will be divided into three equal divisions based on the number of boys' teams and the previous years' 9-12 CBEDS for each school participating in soccer. The schools will be ranked from largest to smallest using the 9-12 CBEDS and then divided by three in order to form the three divisions. The Divisions will contain the largest schools in Division I through the smallest schools in Division III. If the number of schools is not equally divisible by three, thus creating a situation where there are three equal divisions plus one school, then Division III will have one extra school relative to Division I and II. If the number of schools is not equally divisible by three, thus creating a situation where there are three equal divisions plus two schools, then Division III and II will have one extra school each relative to Division I. Girls Divisions will be the same as the Boys Divisions realizing that in Division III there may not be an equal number of boys and girls teams.

NOTE 1: There are no Section Playoffs for Fall or Spring Soccer.

II. ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Soccer Advisory Committee consists of two representatives from each of the following leagues: Eastern Athletic, Northern Athletic, Butte View, Mid Valley, Sacramento Valley (North), Sacramento Valley (South), and Shasta Cascade Leagues. One representative will represent a boys team and one representative will represent a girls team.

III. SEEDING COMMITTEE

The seeding committee shall consist of the existing Soccer Advisory Committee. The Chairman of the Soccer Advisory Committee shall chair the seeding meeting. The

ARTICLE 50 – GENERAL RULES**

500. AUTHORIZED PARTICIPATION

A. All athletic activities in sports approved by the CIF involving two or more member schools must be held under rules and regulations of the participating school's respective league, Section and the CIF.

CIF BYLAW 500

500. AUTHORIZED PARTICIPATION

E. During the school year, all athletic activities in CIF-approved sports involving CIF-member schools must be held under the rules and regulations of the participating school's respective league, Section and the CIF during the established school year (district, section, league).

F. During the summer period, CIF bylaws pertaining to transfer eligibility, undue influence, pre-enrollment contact and athletically motivated transfers apply (Bylaws 205, 207 and 510).

**OUT OF SEASON PLAY
ARTICLE 50 – GENERAL RULES**

511. SEASON OF SPORT DEFINITION

A. The "season of sport" shall be established for each sport by the highest CIF component level in which championship competition is conducted (i.e., State, Section or League) in that sport. To participate in state-level competition for any particular sport, a Section must comply with the CIF adopted "season of sport."

B. The basic sports seasons are:

- Fall - August through November
- Winter - November through February
- Spring - February through June

Basic dates may vary from year-to-year and between Sections within the above specified basic seasons. Championship competition may extend beyond these limits.

C. Sections have the responsibility to work toward equity relative to length of season, number of contests, and number of opportunities for participation by students. The "seasons of sport" for State championships are:
