The Plumas Pines Golf Course and the NSCIF would like to welcome you to the 2006 section boys' golf championships. We are guests of Plumas Pines GC. Please replace all divots, repair all ball marks and rake all sand traps. It is important that all players conduct themselves in the manner of good sportsmanship on the course as well as in and around the clubhouse.

Plumas Pines GC is located at 402 Poplar Valley Rd, in Blairsden, CA. Please contact Brandon at Plumas Pines for directions. Plumas Pines Golf Course (530-836.1420) is a public course so **practice rounds will be available on Monday May 8th for \$25.00 after 1:00pm.** Remember that coaches cannot be with their team on the golf course on Sundays. No metal spikes are allowed at Plumas GCC (soft spikes only). All of the facilities at Plumas Pines GC will be open.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Rules of Golf, as approved by the USGA will be enforced. The NSCIF golf committee and coaches will marshal the golf course. Any questions on rules or interpretation of rules should be directed to the committee members. Hopefully, a scorer will be provided to escort each foursome, but each individual will also keep a scorecard (see below). The NSCIF Golf Committee will make the final decision on all rule interpretations.

DRESS CODE:

No denim jeans/shorts or riveted jeans/shorts are allowed. Team walking shorts are allowed, but must be hemmed. Collared team golf shirts will be worn and kept tucked in at all times. Hats must be worn with the "bill" forward. **Soft spikes only!** Failure to comply with the "dress code" may result in disqualification.

TEE TIMES:

The tournament will begin with a "TEE TIMES" at 12:00pm. Golfers will be paired by their scores from the qualifying tournaments or league average scores. The golfers start hole #1 and their pairings will be posted around the pro shop. Make sure that your team/individual has checked in with the tournament director (Chas Konopka) by 10:30am.

Play:

Play will be from the white tees (Par 72) and the total yardage will be 6105 yards. Play will be with summer rules.

Players:

I will assume your team will be the same players that have played in league or the qualifying tournament. If there is any last minute change, please call me on my cell or at school by Monday, May 8, 2006 by 12:00 noon. (school 384-7900x1311 or cell 624.9436).

Competitor's Sheet

Tournament Guidelines:

1. 18 holes of medal play – USGA rules will apply. Putt everything out!
Pace of play: 4 1/2 hours
2. Summer rules: Play the ball as it lies!
3. The tournament will be played from the white tees.
4. Exchange scorecards with someone who is not in your league. Use two vertical boxes to record the score on each hole. Make numbers neat and precise. Keep your own score on the bottom section of the scorecard. Check hole-by-hole scores carefully before signing and turning in the card. If you sign for a lower score on any hole, you will be disqualified. If you sign for a higher score on any hole, you will get that score. Do not worry about adding your score, the tournament officials will take care of the addition. Get two signatures on each card at the end of 18 holes.
5. Remember, it is a two stroke penalty for swearing and club throwing, so use good golf etiquette – don't get yourself disqualified.
It's also a two-stroke penalty for advice – don't ask!
6. Hit a provisional ball if your ball might be out-of-bounds or lost. Remember, you must announce to your group that you are going to play a provisional ball.
7. If you have any questions with respect to a ruling that can't be determined on the course, play two balls and write down both scores. We will get a ruling at the end of the round.
8. Staked trees/ Cart paths: Ball may be lifted and dropped one club length from the nearest relief – no penalty.
9. Keep your golf bags of all tee boxes and the aprons around the greens.
10. Be able to identify your ball (*a special mark that makes it different from any other ball that is the same brand number*).
11. Leave the course in better condition than when you started: replace all divots, repair all ball marks, rake all sand traps, etc. **Have fun and enjoy your day of golf !**
