Key items for communication between schools:

1. The Foundation Game will not count for section seeding in anyway. It will be viewed as an exhibition game and will not be discussed at the section seeding regardless of the number of games either teams have played.
2. Both teams involved must agree to play the Foundation Game and mark it as such on their schedule.

GUIDELINES FOR FOUNDATION GAMES

1. Schools will be allowed to schedule a 27th game provided it is designated a Foundation Game. Schools/teams **MAY NOT ADD** a Foundation Game once the season starts. All Foundation Games **MUST** be clearly designated on your season schedule when submitted to MaxPreps. It is also recommended to notify the Section Commissioner of any Foundation Games scheduled. Please see Appendix for Application Form.
2. The school may pay standard operating expenses as set by the Section and forward all profits from the game to the Section.
3. Foundation Games **WILL NOT** be counted on either schools record regardless of the number of contests they have.
4. In a two-year scheduling cycle a team must designate the Foundation Game on their schedule, if they choose to play it. The host school would be responsible and pay for only the home contest.
5. One of the two years a school choose to play a 27th game they **must** pay the Section the profits of the one pre-designated Foundation Game. (Schools cannot play 2 years away as the Foundation Game).
6. The year the school is away for a Foundation Game, the traveling school will be responsible for all of their expenses including travel.
7. Any deficits accrued in the Foundation Game will not be reimbursed by the Section.
8. In the 2nd year of a scheduling cycle, if a school adds a 27th game, that school must declare one of their home games as a Foundation Game for that year. Games may be added during the season but a Foundation Game must be declared on the schedule submitted.
9. Schools must forward an itemized report to the section office along with a check for the proceeds. Financial reports and checks must be forwarded to the Section office by the day of the basketball seeding meeting.

The Foundation Game may be for all levels or just a single varsity contest. However, the proceeds from all levels on the designated Foundation Game must be forwarded to the Section office. If a double header is played with boys and girls it is possible to have one game be the Foundation Game and one not. If this is the case, split the night's proceeds and forward half to the section.
