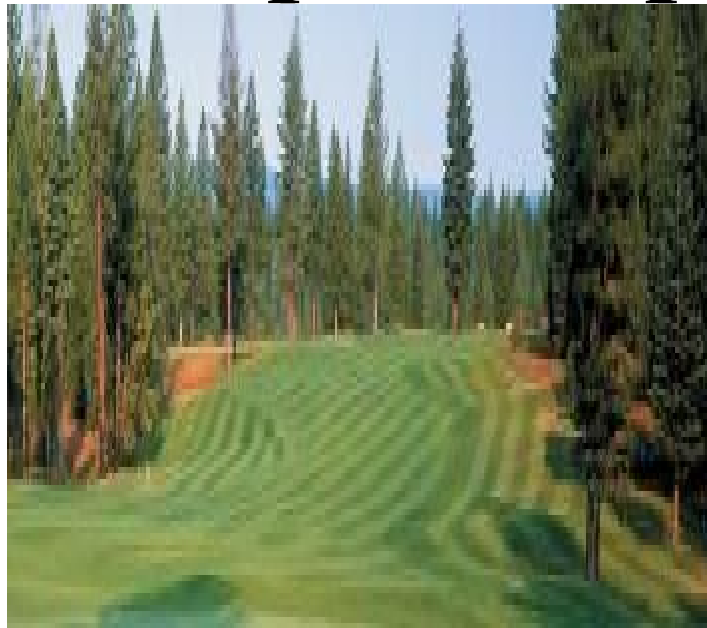

Bailey Creek Golf Course is located off HWY 36 at 433 Durkin Drive in Lake Almanor. Practice rounds can be arranged by calling Kevin Hughes, Director of Golf or the Pro Shop, at (530) 259-4653. Junior rates are \$20 for 18-holes, range balls are \$5.00/bucket . The course is expecting practice round tee requests for Monday, May 11th . Priority is given to the players. Coaches wishing to play will be given tee times based upon availability.

Enclosed with this letter you will find the rules and regulations, times and everything I hope you need to know regarding playing in this NSCIF championship event. The Bailey Creek Golf Course and the NSCIF welcome you to the 2009 Boys Golf Section Championships. We are guests of the Bailey Creek Golf Course. Please replace all divots, repair all ball marks and rake all sand traps. It is important that all players conduct themselves in the manner of good sportsmanship on the course as well as in and around the clubhouse.

Qualifying team/individuals must be accompanied to the section tournaments by a certified coach as defined in CIF bylaw 506 or have a letter signed by the school's principal stating that he/she represents the school.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

The rules of golf as approved by the United States Golf Association will be enforced. The NSCIF Golf Playoff Committee and coaches will marshal the golf course. Any questions on rules or interpretation of rules should be directed to the committee members. A "marker" will be provided to escort each foursome, but each individual will be responsible to keep a scorecard. The Committee along with the club professional will make the final decision on all rule interpretations.

Dress code: No denim jeans/shorts or riveted jeans/shorts are allowed. Team walking shorts are allowed, but must be hemmed. Collared (or mock) team golf shirts will be worn and kept tucked in at all times. Hats must be worn with the bill forward. Soft spikes only! Failure to comply with the dress code may result in disqualification.

Tee times: Times will begin at 10:00 am. Golfers will be paired by their qualifying scores (from their respective Division Championships). Pairings will be posted around the pro shop.

Players: Your qualifying team roster must have been received by the tournament director by 3:00 PM, Friday, May 8th. Make sure that your team/individuals have checked in with the tournament director (Len Massaro) by 9:15 am. on the date of the tournament.

Course services: Range balls will be available for \$5.00/bucket. Pro shop will be open. Snack bar at course is available.

Play: We intend to play summer rules from the BLUE tees (6485). Prior to play, members of the NSCIF Playoff and Rules Committee may make changes based upon weather and course conditions. Pace of play is an emphasis for the CIF/NCGA this year. We will use their pace of play guidelines as a guide. A copy is included and you should discuss these with your players prior to play.

Scoring: Players will each keep someone else's card in their group. A coach will be paired with each group as a "marker". Markers will keep a group card. Players are responsible to see that all cards are correct, signed and attested before being turned in to the scorer's table at the end of the tournament.

Qualifiers: The top two teams and the top four individuals not on those two teams qualify for the NorCal Championship at Butte Creek Country Club in Chico on Monday, May 18, 2009.

Coaches: Please remember that no coaching is allowed during the course of play! All coaches/school representative are expected to act as "markers".

A marker's responsibilities, as defined by the NSCIF Golf Committee, will be:

- " Supervise the assigned group of golfers
- Interpret rules
- Record the correct score for each player
- Maintain pace of play
- Safety of the players
- Gallery control
- Forecaddy
- Player conduct"

Galleries: We encourage spectators to attend this championship event. However, all spectators must stay 30 yards or more from the players. Spectators are to follow the golfers on the cart paths and not down the fairway. A breach of this rule may result in a two stroke penalty assessed to the player and possible disqualification.

Electronic Devices: For safety reasons, all electronic devices (cell phones, media players, etc.) are banned from use by players during all NSCIF competitions.

Competitor's Sheet

Tournament Guidelines:

1. 18 holes of medal play - USGA rules will apply. Putt everything out! Pace of play: 4.5 hours!
2. Summer rules: Play the ball as it lies!
3. The tournament will be played from the BLUE Tees.
4. Exchange scorecards with someone in your foursome that does not have your scorecard Use two vertical boxes to record the score on each hole. Make numbers neat and precise. Keep your score on the bottom. Check hole by hole scores carefully before signing and turning in the card. If you sign for a lower score on any hole you will be disqualified. If you sign for a higher score on any hole that is what you will get. Do not worry about adding your scores, the tournament officials will take care of the addition. Get two signatures on each card at the end of 18 holes.
5. Remember, it is a two stroke penalty for unsportsmanship (ie. Swearing, equipment throwing, trash-talking). Use good golf etiquette – don't get yourself disqualified.

It is also a two stroke penalty for giving or asking for advice – don't do it!

All spectators must stay 30 yards or more from the players. They are to follow the golfers on the cart paths and not down the fairway. A breach of this rule may result in a two-stroke penalty assessed to the player and possible disqualification.
6. Slow play – Each group should try to keep up with the group in front of them. If needed, a group will be warned once to speed up pace of play. Each subsequent offense will result in a one-stroke penalty on each member of the group and possible disqualification.
7. Hit a provisional ball if your ball might be out of bounds or lost. Make sure that you state in advance that you are hitting a provisional ball.
8. Tournament director will review course OB and hazard information prior to tee time. However, each player is responsible for knowing local rules.
9. If you have any questions with respect to a ruling that can't be determined on the course, play two balls and write down both scores. We will get a ruling at the end of the round from the rules committee.
10. Keep your golf bags off all tee boxes and the aprons around the greens.
11. Be able to identify your ball (a special mark that makes it different from any other ball that is the same brand and number).
12. Electronic Devices: For safety reasons, all electronic devices (cell phones, media players, etc.) are banned from use by players during all NSCIF competitions.
13. Leave the course in better condition than when you started: replace all divots, repair all ball marks, rake all sand traps, etc., Have fun and enjoy your day of golf!!!!

XXI. PACE OF PLAY

The published Pace of Play is the **MAXIMUM TIME** allowed, **NOT** the expected time and includes time for the normal problems faced during the round. You should play faster if you do not have problems.

Monitor yourself; finish times are printed on your scorecard. Carry a watch and check how you are doing between holes.

If you get behind, walk faster, play more efficiently, get ready for your shot while others are playing.

Your responsibilities are:

- Play within the time allotted through the checkpoint holes

Or, if you are not the first group:

- Finish the checkpoint holes within 14 minutes of the group in front of you

If you fail to meet at least one of your responsibilities:

- Potential one-stroke penalty for everyone in the group at the first checkpoint
- Potential two-stroke penalty for everyone in the group at the second checkpoint

If you feel you are not the problem, ask an official to monitor the group. If there is a specific player who is causing the problem, let the official know who you believe to be the problem.

If you do get penalized you may appeal.

If you turn in your card without appealing, the stroke(s) will be added to your score.

Catching up on the back nine does not absolve you from possible penalties you were assessed on the front nine.

Appeals are only granted if you have been:

- Delayed by Committee
- Delayed because of circumstances beyond your control
- Delayed because of another player in the group
