A couple of issues to remember...
All new incoming student/athletes, except incoming 9th graders, have paperwork to submit for approval.

For transfer students, after the 207 /209/510 form is complete, please make a copy and mail the originals to: NSCIF Section Office. 2241 St. George Lane #2, Chico, CA 95926. No member of the school's coaching staff, paid or volunteer may serve as the resident family for the foreign transfer student.

All students making a valid change of residence must complete the 206 form. For it to be considered a valid change, the complete family with which the student established residential eligibility must vacate the first residence and move with permanent intent and **without** athletic motivation. It is the school administration's duty to verify that it is indeed a valid move. This form can be faxed to the Section Office, 343-5619.

Please remember to receive the approval notification from the Section office prior to allowing any new student/athlete to participate in a scrimmage or a game. To check the status of your transfer paperwork, please go to the Section web page, then click on *status*, on the left hand page. To get your password, email Cindy and she will send it to you.

Remember that you must allow 20 working days maximum for the paperwork to be approved at the Section Office. Hardship requests take longer time to process than the limited, first transfers, and non participation 207 requests.

State Constitution bylaw new this year-

313. CONCUSSION PROTOCOL

A student-athlete who is suspected of sustaining a concussion or head injury in a practice or game shall be removed from competition at that time for the remainder of the day. A student-athlete who has been removed from play may not return to play until the athlete is evaluated by a licensed health care provider trained in education and management of concussion and receives written clearance to return to play from that health care provider.

Q: What is meant by "licensed health care provider?"

A: The "scope of practice" for licensed health care providers and medical professionals is defined by California state statutes. This scope of practice will limit the evaluation to a medical doctor (MD) or doctor of osteopathy (DO).
